Lewis Brinkworth was lucky enough to be one of 35 Under 16 boys selected from across Australia to take part in the Rugby Australia Lloyd McDermott Team at the Ella 7s Tournament in Sydney recently.

The Ella 7s is the marquee event for Indigenous Sevens Rugby in Australia and is named after the famed Ella Brothers, Gary, Glen and Mark. The Ella 7s is the flagship Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Rugby Union 7s tournament, that attracts around 400 athletes, 20 State Class Referees and ball boys, and over 20 officials from Rugby Australia and NSW Rugby Union.

The tournament is a key tool to bringing the game of Sevens to the wider Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander population, with many of the players going on to represent the Australian Sevens program.

On March 1st, 13 of our deadly Wathaurong Aboriginal Co-operative Staff celebrated their achievement of graduating from RMIT with a Graduate Certificate in Family Violence.

This pilot educational program was co-designed to deliver education in a culturally safe way and in a setting that allowed for collaboration, connectedness and provided space for trauma informed practices to be implemented in the learning environment.

Staff from all areas of Wathaurong Aboriginal Co-operative were involved in completing their Graduate Certificate in Domestic & Family Violence, including team members from Social & Emotional Wellbeing, the Colac Gathering Place, Family Services and Community Strengthening.

Not only have these staff graduated with a formal qualification, they have also been armed with new tools and knowledge to help them to provide the best possible support for our community.

Wathaurong would like to say a huge thank you to RMIT and Ngarara Willim, in particular Dr Lisa Harris who delivered the educational component of the Graduate Certificate, for their support and understanding of the need to deliver education in a different way.

Funding for the delivery of this Graduate Certificate to our staff was provided through Family Safety Dhelk Dja and we thank them, and in particular the Barwon South West Dhelk Dja, for their support through this process.

The staff celebrated with a graduation ceremony at Wah Bar on the Pier, with RMIT staff, newly appointed Board member Uncle Glenn Shea, and Member for Geelong Christine Couzens in attendance to congratulate our newest graduates.

# KOORIE FAMILIES AS FIRST EDUCATORS



0-5yrs

Smalltalk is an 8 week supportive program for parents and caregivers of children aged birth - 5 years. The program aims to:

- Increase parents' confidence to do the things we know can have a positive impact on their child's learning
- Help parents understand how activities we already do in the home enhances our children's learning and development
- Give ideas on how parents can looked after themselves and help build links with their community and local services



#### **Circle of Security Parenting**

Circle of Security is an 8 week supportive program for parents and caregivers of children aged birth - 5 years. The program aims to:

- Help parents/caregivers understand how to build feelings of security for children in their early years.
- Assist parents/caregivers with skills to build on the positive relationship with their child
- Develop confidence in parents/caregivers to respond to their children in a way which builds a secure foundation.







#### Indigenous Triple P

0 - 5yrs

Indigenous Triple P program is an 8 week program for parents and caregivers of children aged birth - 5 years. This program aims to:

- Help parents/caregivers manage behaviour confidently and encourage behaviour you like.
- Assist parents/caregivers with becoming more confident and managing self-care for yourselves
- Further develop and strengthen family relationships



- Or just let the Lifeblood staff know at the time of your donation when you are in the donor centre.






#### JANUARY 2023 SCHOOL HOLIDAY PROGRAM

# COMMUNITY WORKSHOPS AND YARNS TO DEISAN OUR NEW JOURNEY WALKING SERVICE

On Friday 10 February, we held two community workshops to hear from community about how they wanted the Journey Walking Service to look for our mob.

We got funding from the Victorian Government to design and deliver a Journey Walking Service. The aim is to provide a service for people who are having a tough time in their relationships or families, or maybe worried about their behaviour or that of someone that they love. This service will help them to get the support they need, and ensure that they have someone to walk with, advocate alongside and support them when engaging with other services and dealing with what might be happening at home.



We had a number of Wathaurong community come along to tell us what they think the service should look like, how it should work and what is important to ensure that our mob can feel safe engaging and trust the service. We heard about the importance of ensuring that the service is staffed by Aboriginal staff who are known to community, and that the service has the flexibility to meet the person where they are and help them in practical ways in what can be challenging times.

We are planning for the Journey Walking Service will be operational by 1 July 2023. We will be recruiting for Journey Walkers, who will be people who have the skill to work with our mob, navigate complex services and systems, and listen to what is going on. We will be sure to put the job ads in the newsletter and promote to Wathaurong community when the job ads go live.

A big thanks to community who came and shared their views and experiences – including our pictured doggie friend who joined (and patiently waited outside for some pats in the lunch break!)





#### CHILD SAFE POLICY

Over the past eight years there have been a number of enquiries into the historical abuse of children whilst in the care of institutions. What these enquiries found was that the abuse of children was widespread throughout different types of institutions and all across the country. This abuse was particularly the case for vulnerable children, including Aboriginal children who may have been separated from family and kin.

In order to stop abuse occurring, it is now an obligation for most agency's across Victoria to become Child SAFE, including Wathaurong Aboriginal Co-operative. This means having a more diligent approach in recruitment and management practices, reporting and investigating incidences of child abuse perpetrated by the agency's staff or volunteers, listening to clients and community more if they have a concern about their safety when receiving a service, and having a strong culture of zero tolerance of abuse of children and young people. Each and every Wathaurong staff member or volunteer, including Foster Carers, is expected to manage themselves in a way that is consistent with keeping children safe from harm. See below Wathaurong's formal Statement of Commitment and how community members or clients can express concerns for children's safety.

Wathaurong Aboriginal Co-operative is committed to providing a safe and friendly environment for children and young people, and Wathaurong has zero tolerance for any form of abuse of children and young people, including sexual abuse, physical abuse, emotional abuse, cultural abuse, and neglect.

Wathaurong is committed to ensuring all children engaged with its services are culturally safe, including children from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds and children with disabilities. Wathaurong believes in the right of a child to safety in their physical and online environments.

Wathaurong Aboriginal Co-operative understands its obligations under the Commission for Children and Young People's Child Safe and Reportable Conduct schemes, as well as Victorian laws such as the Failure to Disclose offence and mandatory reporting obligations under the Children Youth and Families Act. Wathaurong will uphold these obligations in the best interest of Aboriginal children.

Wathaurong will make sure we include children and families in the decisions that affect them, and we understand how children's active participation in their care arrangements helps to prevent abuse – we will listen to children and young people and take their concerns seriously.

For situations requiring police support or advice, call **Geelong Police**.

Are you seeking emergency accommodation? Call **Salvo Connect** (Homeless support provider for over 25s) for advice on housing and welfare support.

**Barwon Youth** (Homeless support provider for 24 and under) can help young people with accommodation and welfare support

**Feed Me Geelong/Bellarine** can provide support with free essential grocery deliveries.

**Uniting Care** and **Salvo Connect** can help with providing food vouchers.

**Yarning Safe N Strong** is a culturally safe 24/7 confidential crisis line managed by VAHS.

The **Suicide Call Back Line** is a 24/7 service that provides free telephone, video and online counselling for anyone 15 years and older affected by suicide

**Beyond Blue** offers a 24/7 service providing mental health advice and support via phone, web chat or email.

**Kids Helpline** offers 24/7 mental health support for young people aged 5-25.

**Barwon Health Mental Health Triage** offers 24/7 support for phone advice, referrals and intake.
