Vaughan has been actively involved in youth leadership camps and mentorship, inspiring young people to connect with one another and their culture. He has also travelled to WA to support a community member who was bailed to another state, going above and beyond to provide support to at risk youth. through circuit breaker work. Vaughan has also spent time reflecting on young people's needs and wants when they come into contact with the justice system. He has initiated suggestions to engage youth in the Barwon Region ahead of the development of Wathaurong's Youth Hub. and has a strong focus on strengthening culture, embedding cultural learning into every interaction, resulting in positive change for young people. Vaughan's ability to connect with the youth has seen the level of engagement with the YJ program go to another level.

Ebony as Community Development Officer for the Colac Gathering Place, goes beyond her 9-5 role by volunteering and serving on various committees and advisory groups.

In her capacity as BSW RAJAC Chairperson for the last two years and BSW Dehlk Dja Chairperson for the last three years, Ebony has been pivotal in advocating for the rights and protection of our Aboriginal people and communities across the Barwon South West region. She has been a key advocate for Aboriginal communities in the Barwon South West, holding police, education, and child protection departments accountable at Aboriginal Justice Forums. Ebony has also been involved in developing protocols against family violence (YAN YAN, and Paneeyt Kanditj) and advocating for the Aboriginal Youth Cautioning Program to be embedded across the area.

VICTORIAN PUBLIC HEALTH AWARDS

Congratulations to our Wathaurong Health Team, who along with Barwon Health and the City of Greater Geelong Maternal Child Health Team have been nominated for an award at the upcoming Victorian Public Health Awards, in the category of "Excellence in Aboriginal Health and Wellbeing." Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children face a significant issue with middle ear infections known as otitis media, with rates much higher than non-Aboriginal populations. To address this, a collaborative initiative was launched to improve early detection and intervention of ear problems. The project, driven by Aboriginal stakeholders has enhanced referral pathways, provided culturally appropriate services, and reduced chronic ear infections. The final award winners will be announced at the Victorian Public Healthcare Awards Gala Night, to be held Thursday 16 November 2023.



Regardless of where we live, or who our Mob is, we can all go through tough times, times when we don't feel great about our lives or ourselves.


That's why it's important to always be looking out for each other, and ask R U OK?

COMMUNITY STRENGTHENING UPDATE

The Community Strengthening Team are excited to announce the launch of their new Aboriginal Access Points Program.

The Aboriginal Access Points program is part of the 2019-20 funding commitment of \$2.6 million for the operation of three Aboriginal-designed and led family violence services as a complementary service model to The Orange Door Network.

What will the Aboriginal Access Points do?

Our Community Strengthening Facilitators will walk alongside community members experiencing or at risk of family violence by;

- Being a known and trusted entry point to the family violence service system for community members;
- Encouraging community members to navigate services by breaking down barriers and demystifying the processes;
- Advocating for community members and empowering them to engage safely and meaningfully with services;
- Identify the unique needs of community members, refer them to additional services and provide brokerage as needed; and
- Providing culturally safe and grounding services and supporting community members to connect with culture and community.

Eligibility

To access the program, an individual must be an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person who is:

- Impacted by family violence; and
- Living on or from the Wathaurong community

Along with one of the below factors present:

- Be navigating a number of support services and requiring advocacy and support.
- Community member is disengaged with services, at risk of disengagement or reluctant to engage.
- Deemed to be at lower risk
- A young person impacted by family violence (with parental consent in line with Wathaurong's existing policies if aged under 16)

Non-Aboriginal family members or carers of an Aboriginal person will be considered on a caseby-case basis.




ITS A MOB THING

CHILD SAFE POLICY

Over the past eight years there have been a number of enquiries into the historical abuse of children whilst in the care of institutions. What these enquiries found was that the abuse of children was widespread throughout different types of institutions and all across the country. This abuse was particularly the case for vulnerable children, including Aboriginal children - who may have been separated from family and kin.

In order to stop abuse occurring, it is now an obligation for most agency's across Victoria to become Child SAFE, including Wathaurong Aboriginal Co-operative. This means having a more diligent approach in recruitment and management practices, reporting and investigating incidences of child abuse perpetrated by the agency's staff or volunteers, listening to clients and community more if they have a concern about their safety when receiving a service, and having a strong culture of zero tolerance of abuse of children and young people. Each and every Wathaurong staff member or volunteer, including Foster Carers, is expected to manage themselves in a way that is consistent with keeping children safe from harm. See below Wathaurong's formal Statement of Commitment and how community members or clients can express concerns for children's safety.

Wathaurong Aboriginal Co-operative is committed to providing a safe and friendly environment for children and young people, and Wathaurong has zero tolerance for any form of abuse of children and young people, including sexual abuse, physical abuse, emotional abuse, cultural abuse, and neglect.

Wathaurong is committed to ensuring all children engaged with its services are culturally safe, including children from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds and children with disabilities. Wathaurong believes in the right of a child to safety in their physical and online environments.

Wathaurong Aboriginal Co-operative understands its obligations under the Commission for Children and Young People's Child Safe and Reportable Conduct schemes, as well as Victorian laws such as the Failure to Disclose offence and mandatory reporting obligations under the Children Youth and Families Act. Wathaurong will uphold these obligations in the best interest of Aboriginal children.

Wathaurong will make sure we include children and families in the decisions that affect them, and we understand how children's active participation in their care arrangements helps to prevent abuse – we will listen to children and young people and take their concerns seriously.

If you need help in an emergency, contact Ambulance, Police, Fire Brigade

The **After Hours National Home Doctor Service** provides non-emergency medical assistance.

If you need legal advice or support, get in touch with the **Victorian Aboriginal Legal Service**.

The Orange Door can provide family violence support from 9am-5pm Monday to Friday. Outside these hours, contact **Safe Steps** for support, referrals and refuge 24/7.

For Drug & Alcohol advice, call the **DirectLine** 24 Hour referral service.

For situations requiring police support or advice, call **Geelong Police**.

Are you seeking emergency accommodation? Call **Salvo Connect** (Homeless support provider for over 25s) for advice on housing and welfare support.

Barwon Youth (Homeless support provider for 24 and under) can help young people with accommodation and welfare support

Feed Me Geelong/Bellarine can provide support with free essential grocery deliveries.

Uniting Care and **Salvo Connect** can help with providing food vouchers.

Yarning Safe N Strong is a culturally safe 24/7 confidential crisis line managed by VAHS.

Brother to Brother is a 24/7 confidential support service specifically for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander men run by **Dardi Munwarro.**

Lifeline is a 24/7 crisis support service. Calls to Lifeline from a mobile phone (whether prepaid or plan) are free. Calls from a landline or home phone are charged as a local call

The **Suicide Call Back Line** is a 24/7 service that provides free telephone, video and online counselling for anyone 15 years and older affected by suicide

Beyond Blue offers a 24/7 service providing mental health advice and support via phone, web chat or email.

Kids Helpline offers 24/7 mental health support for young people aged 5-25.

Barwon Health Mental Health Triage offers 24/7 support for phone advice, referrals and intake.
